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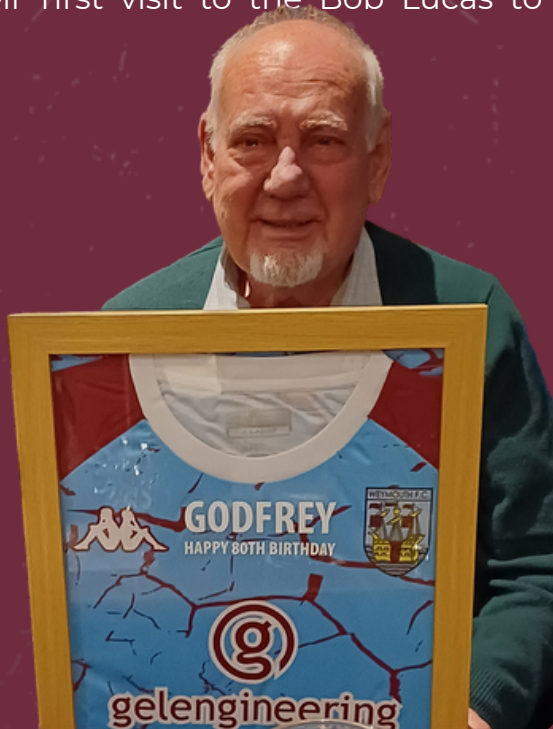
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INTRODUCING OUR MATCH SPONSOR THE FAMILY OF GODFREY SPRACKLEN

Well known Wykeite and dedicated Terras' fan Godfrey Spracklen passed away during the close season aged 81 years. Members of his family are remembering the much-loved and popular man this afternoon who rarely missed a home game over 60-plus years of devotion. Amongst their number are grand-daughters Dani and Jess Beals who are making their first visit to the Bob Lucas to support their home-town team. It is believed that Godfrey started supporting Weymouth in 1962 while employed at Sapsworth Meat Factory in Camp Road, Wyke. The Terras were a colossal force in non-league football back then and the Chairman was Mr. Sapsworth who also worked at the factory along with the club's then centre-half who worked on the meat bench. This was when Weymouth enjoyed a tumultuous run in the FA Cup, securing Northern ties at Morecambe and then Preston.

Godfrey and friends took long trips on the train, leaving late at night. The trip to Preston was memorable because, when they got to the ground, fog descended and they couldn't see the players. All they could see was Weymouth's goalkeeper, Billy Bly, left alone on the pitch when all the other players had been taken off due to poor visibility! The game was eventually abandoned and sadly, precious few away fans, including Godfrey, could make the replayed game.

After that introduction Godfrey was to witness the full decades-long roller-coaster ride that comes with the territory as a Weymouth fan. Not surprisingly he counted the FA Cup double-header with Nottingham Forest in 2005 as a major highlight - joining hundreds of supporters on the train to the City Ground for the initial First Round tie before experiencing the heartbreak of a narrow 2-0 defeat at the Wessex in the replay.

Like all Terras' fans Godfrey was disappointed to see his side relegated at the end of last season but he would have been full of optimism as always today - the start of a new campaign against old rivals Dorchester. He would have loved nothing more than to witness the club's resurgence as it hopefully works its way back up the pyramid.

We need you, the Terras fans, to bring the atmosphere today to help the team secure local bragging rights and begin the season with three points.

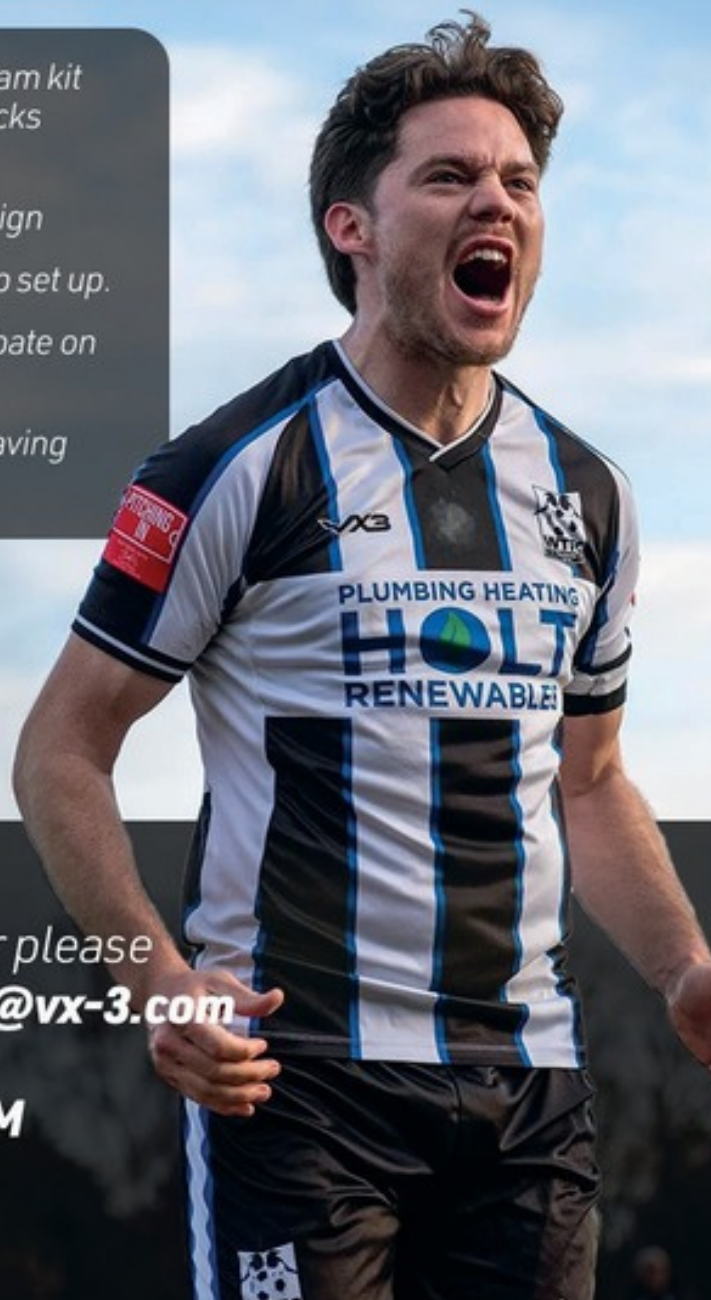
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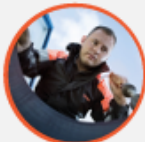
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FROM THE Terraces

NUMBERS BEHIND THE GAME



vs Dorchester Town

A new season beckons but in one way little has changed as we face local rivals Dorchester! There are many statistical quirks surrounding our curtain raiser this weekend but first I need to address a mis-reported fact – this will NOT be our first season at step 4 of the non-league pyramid but it is the first time since 1920/21 that our most senior football has been played at step 4. That season we plied our trade in the Dorset league with two Western league divisions and one Southern division above us.

One of the statistical quirks is being drawn to play Dorchester on the opening day meaning there have only been three league games since our last clash – a record with a season break in between – and it is the first time we have played another Dorset team in the first league game of a campaign since Blandford United in 1930!

This is the second time though that the Ridgway derby has been played as the league debut game in a season but we have to go way back to 1899 for that encounter – a game that just happens to be our record win against anyone - a 16-0 victory when our opponents pretty much downed tools in a protest against the scheduling of the fixture.

We haven't always had it so easy against the Magpies but recent encounters have definitely gone the way of the Terras with 14 competitive games without a loss stretching back to a Southern league game in 2015. At home its 11 games in league and cup since a victory at the Bob Lucas stadium for the black & whites, a Dorset Senior cup win in 2011. The last time Dorchester travelled back up north with all three points from Weymouth was incredibly 33 years ago in 1993!

In terms of personnel who have featured for both clubs there have of course been hundreds but there are two who have crossed the divide just this summer – Wes Fogden moving from north to south with Matty Burrows travelling in the opposite direction.

Who comes out on top in this game will enjoy bragging rights until we meet again in the league in March but, I am sure all fans will want a more exciting game than the April encounter – the first 0-0 Ridgeway derby in 14 years and only the 5th overall!

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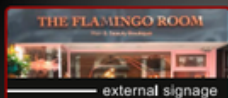
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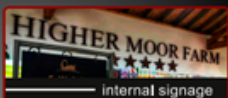
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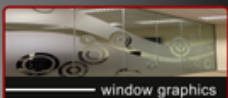

DORCHESTER TOWN HISTORY

The history of Dorchester Town Football Club can be traced back originally to 1871 and the founding of The Dorchester Football Club. Like many clubs of that era, the Club played the rules of football that later evolved to become what is known today as rugby, but nevertheless the club quickly "attained an enviable reputation for respectability and skill" according to the Dorset County Chronicle.

By the end of the decade, the craze of Association Rules for the game of football had swept along the south coast, and on Monday, 18th October 1880, the town's men gathered in The Kings' Arms Hotel to "resuscitate" The Dorchester Football Club under association rules. They would play their home games at The Recreation Ground on Weymouth Avenue, which was home to the cricket club in the summer months. Leonard Robinson became the club's first-ever captain, a position he would hold for many years.

Due to the importance of the town's economy to the wider region, while most of the country typically took their half-holiday on a Saturday afternoon, the townsfolk of Dorchester took theirs on a Thursday, the day after market day. While the Saturday team of Dorchester Football Club struggled in the Dorset League, the Thursday team excelled. The town's unique weekend arrangements meant that many Dorchester clubs struggled to organise matches with opposition on Thursdays or to muster a team for Saturday matches outside of town. In the 1908/09 season, the club imposed a policy of only playing fellow Dorchester teams and visiting military teams.

However, this policy only lasted for one season, and in the following year, an alternative plan was drawn up. On 26 August 1910, representatives from Dorchester United (cricket), Rovers (cycling), Athletic, and Wanderers attended The Dorchester Football Club AGM and agreed to join them to create "a

team worthy of the good old town of Dorchester."

It was here that the club adopted its new name of Dorchester Town Football Club to signify its new united ambition for the town. In 1929, the club moved from the Recreation Ground to the dedicated Avenue Football Ground. Just five years later, a remarkable event took place at the ground on 30 August 1934. To commemorate the centenary of the Tolpuddle Martyrs, Lloyd George MP, the last of the Liberal Prime Ministers held a rally at a packed Avenue Ground. In the afternoon, Dorchester Town hosted the London Labour Football Club, followed in the evening by a game against an international workers' XI.

With post-war football thriving across the country, the club joined the Western League in 1947 and two years later turned professional with Mr. K.W. Holland declaring, "People will not turn up in large numbers to watch Dorset league football." With the club now averaging gates of between 1000-1500, the club were able to attract bigger names to the club - none more so than former Wolves Goalkeeper, Ken Bird, who joined as player-manager from AFC Bournemouth. Bird quickly led the Magpies to success, winning the Western League Championship in 1954/55. The same year also saw us reach the First Round Proper of the FA Cup. Qualifying rounds saw us score victories over Poole, Bournemouth Gasworks, Portland and Winchester. In the first round, the club hosted fellow non-leaguer's Bedford Town in front of a gate of 3,500. A 2-0 win saw the club rewarded with the plum tie of York City at home. A record crowd of 5,750 packed out the Avenue Ground, but despite taking the lead, the Magpies would fall short, losing 5-2. York would go on to make the semi-finals that year.

The following year (1955/56), Dorchester Town once again made the first round proper. Having put aside Newport IoW in

the final qualifying round, the club was drawn away to Norwich City. A packed Carrow Road saw the Magpies fall to a 4-0 defeat. They again reached the First Round proper in 1956/57. After being taken to a replay by Bideford, their reward was a trip to Loftus Road to face Queen's Park Rangers, where they once again fell to a 4-0 defeat. For the fourth year running, Dorchester Town reached the First Round Proper in a campaign that really turned heads. A local derby was on the cards in the fourth qualifying round as the club was drawn away to then high-flying local rivals Weymouth. Almost 6,000 were in attendance as a 2-2 draw brought them back over the Ridge, where a packed-out Avenue Ground watched the Magpies defeat the old enemy 2-1. The prize was the visit of the then-famous amateur team - and indeed holders of the FA Amateur Cup - Wycombe Wanderers. The Magpies ran out 3-2 winners in a pulsating game. An away trip to Plymouth Argyle would await, but again, they would stumble to a heavy defeat to league opposition, this time 5-2. Then in '59, Dorchester Town were at it again. A Dinky Curtis goal against Weymouth gave the club another derby cup victory and put them in the First Round hat, where they were drawn away to Port Vale. Bill Gillett equalised, but the team slipped to a narrow 2-1 defeat.

The club joined the Southern League (South) in 1972 and five years later finished runners-up to Margate to gain promotion to the Premier Division. The following season saw the Magpies curtailed by the formation of The Alliance League (now The National League). Struggling in their initial season in the Premier Division (1978-79), they fell four places short of making the cut into the new league and were placed into the reformed Southern Division. Dorchester Town celebrated their centenary season by winning the Southern Division at the first time of asking, but with no promotion to the Alliance Premier in its first season of existence, they were denied the chance to

play at the highest level of non-league football.

The following season, the club once again tasted FA Cup glory. A replay win over Minehead saw them rewarded with an all-Dorset clash at home to AFC Bournemouth in front of a sold-out Avenue Ground. A famous Paul Thorne goal took the club back to Dean Court, where a last gasp extra-time goal broke Magpies hearts.

A severe financial crisis hit in the mid-eighties, with relegation and near bankruptcy. However, a remarkable season in 1986/87 saw the club win the league and return to the Premier Division. Having come so close to losing the club in the late 80s, Peter Aiken and the board realised that the old Avenue Ground had begun to outlive its purpose and brokered a deal with Tesco and the landowners, the Duchy of Cornwall, to develop a new stadium for the club. The move saw Dorchester Town establish themselves in the Southern Premier in the early 90s, before Stuart Morgan took over and led the club to sixth in 1994/95 and fourth in 1997/98, along with cup success including reaching the FA Cup First Round Proper once again, where they were knocked out away at Oxford United,

That season also saw the club reach the last sixteen of the FA Trophy. Having beaten Slough, Sutton, and Salisbury, the club hosted Woking at a sold-out Avenue Stadium. In a highly eventful game that will go down in club folklore, the Cards (and eventual winners) scored in the last minute to win 3-2. After a poor start to the 1999/2000 season, manager Stuart Morgan was relieved of his position as manager and was replaced by Mark Morris. Morris was able to steer the club out of the relegation zone in his first season but was unable to repeat the feat the following season when the Magpies lost the Premier Division place they had held for fourteen seasons. That season did see the club

again reach the FA Cup First Round Proper, where, despite taking the lead, they lost 2-1 away to high-flying Wigan Athletic.

The Magpies threatened to regain their Premier Division status in their first season in the Eastern Division but finished in third place. However, they achieved their objective the following season, when after a fine campaign with only five defeats, the club returned to the Premier Division as Champions. In the first season back in the Premier Division, the club reached the play-offs for promotion to the newly launched Conference South. Having won away at Bath City, a swan-song Matty Holmes performance inspired the stripes to a 2-0 victory over Tiverton at Exeter City's St James' Park to become founding members of the Conference South. The Magpies almost reached the play-offs once again in their inaugural season in the Conference South, but missed out on another promotion opportunity on the final day of the season. The following season saw Mark Morris resign to be replaced by Mick Jenkins. Jenkins reign was short lived and the club went through a handful of managers until former Dorchester player and reserve team manager Phil Simkin took over. The club stalwart guided the Magpies to their greatest FA Cup triumph in the modern era as the club beat Plymouth Argyle 1-0 in the first round proper, in a match televised

live. The reward was a trip to Luton Town in the second round, where the Magpies narrowly lost 2-1 in a pulsating game. Simkin would lead the Magpies to eight in the Conference South the following season, before financial difficulties hit the club and they were subsequently relegated to the Southern Premier League South. Whilst the club fought to get its finances back in order, the club spent many years in the wilderness, constantly fighting against relegation.

That would eventually change when former player Glenn Howes returned to the club as manager and sparked a revival. That revival was further enhanced when Howes invited Tommy Killick to return to the club half way through the 23/24 season, to take over as manager, with Howes becoming his number two. Killick - an Avenue cult hero in his playing days - had seen remarkable success as manager at Poole Town, spanning well over a decade. Howes had been his number two at Poole for a number of years before embarking on his own managerial career, where he led Blackfield & Langley from the Wessex 1 to the Southern Premier League. Now reunited, the pair led Dorchester to 9th place in the 2023/24 season, before reaching the play-offs the following season. The Magpies would lose out to eventual play-off winners AFC Totton in the last minute of extra-time in a remarkable game.

Ryan Hall Goalkeeper Hall returned to the club on a permanent deal this summer, having previously enjoyed a loan spell with the Magpies from Aldershot Town during the 2022/23 season. Following his time with Aldershot, the keeper spent two campaigns with Isthmian Premier Division side Bognor Regis Town before linking up with boss Glenn Howes, who also signed him during his initial loan spell at The Avenue, at Gosport Borough last season.

Harvey-Joe Bertrand An attacking right-back who is also comfortable in central defence, Bertrand is another returning Magpie back home at The Avenue this summer. Having made more than 50 appearances following his debut in 2022, when he joined on dual registration from Blackfield & Langley, the defender returned for a second spell after signing from Bashley in June 2026. The former AFC Bournemouth academy full-back also has Southern League experience with Wimborne Town.

Ieuan Turner A former U18s and U23s captain who has progressed through to the senior side, Turner made his Southern League debut for the club in 2023 and, prior to this season, had made 70 first team appearances in the heart of the Magpies defence. The promising central defender returned to The Avenue this summer fresh from a loan spell at Bashley, where he gained valuable Southern League Division One South experience during the previous campaign.

Will Spetch Club captain Spetch joined the club in September 2023 from neighbours Poole Town. A hugely experienced centre back, Spetch made over 450 appearances for the Dolphins, before switching to the Magpies where he is now in his fourth season. Having nearly reached a century of appearances in black and white in the Magpies defence, Spetch has also proved a major aerial threat from set-pieces, scoring 13 goals in that time - including a memorable last gasp injury-

time header at Hungerford on the final day of the 2024/25 season, which secured a play-off place. The defender also took on the role of player/coach as part of Glenn Howes' management staff this past summer.

Ollie Haste A versatile left-sided defender, Haste signed with Dorchester Town permanently from Yeovil Town in August 2024, following an impressive season on loan. Haste's all action displays during his season-long loan saw him win the Supporters' Player of the Season award, and he further delighted Magpies fans by making the move permanent the following summer, despite interest from numerous other clubs. Previously won the Southern Premier League South whilst on loan at Truro City and also spent a period on loan at his hometown club Barnstaple.

Tega Agberhiere A former Republic of Ireland youth international, Agberhiere signed in June 2026 having been part of the AFC Totton squad that won promotion to the National League South in the 2024/25 campaign. The attacking full-back arrived at The Avenue having progressed through the academy at Waterford in Ireland to U19 level, and then gained experience playing in the USA on a soccer scholarship at Western Texas College, before making a move to Norwegian Third Division side Florø SK. Following a season in Norway, the left sided defender then made the switch back to the UK with Totton in October 2024, with one of his first appearances coming against the Magpies in the FA Trophy.

Corby Moore Vice-captain Moore joined the Magpies from Poole Town in September 2023 after making 260 appearances for the Dolphins and helping them win promotion to the National League South. The central midfielder began his career with Southampton before spells in the United States with Indy Eleven and a return to England with Forest Green Rovers, Bishop's Stortford

and Chelmsford City. Arriving at The Avenue alongside Will Spetch in 2023, Moore quickly established himself as a key part of the Magpies midfield and set-piece specialist, and prior to the start of the new season, he had made 127 appearances in black and white - the most of any player in the current squad.

Matt Buse Buse joined Dorchester Town in July 2024 from National League South side Truro City. A combative central midfielder, he has extensive experience at Step One and Two of the non-league ladder, having previously featured clubs including Yeovil Town, Torquay United and Weymouth, whilst also making over 100 appearances for Taunton Town. In his debut season at The Avenue, Buse was a regular in the Magpies side, showing both his defensive and attacking versatility with appearances in addition to his usual central midfield role at wing-back and further forward in attacking midfield, as well as chipping in with his share of goals.

Tom Purrington Central midfielder Purrington returned to Dorchester Town this past summer after initially enjoying a loan spell at the club from Plymouth Argyle in 2019, before joining permanently for the duration of the 2021/22 campaign. The Exeter-born midfielder progressed through Argyle's academy, earning a professional contract and making his first-team debut in the EFL Trophy in 2018. Having gone on to feature for Tiverton Town, Plymouth Parkway and most recently Taunton Town all at Southern League Premier South level over recent seasons, Purrington is now back in the Magpies midfield for a third spell.

Lewis Toms Back at The Avenue for a second spell, Toms impressed while progressing through from our U18s and U23s to the senior squad, with the central midfielder making his Southern League debut at just 16 years old back in the 2022/23 season under boss Glenn Howes. The midfielder returned this past summer

having gained valuable first team experience with Portland United, Winchester City and Brockenhurst over the past couple of seasons.

Jack Winsor Former Torquay United midfielder Winsor progressed through the club's academy before signing his first professional contract at Plainmoor, and he has since gone on to gain valuable Southern League experience with Willand Rovers and, more recently, AFC Bideford, where he made more than 100 appearances across the past three and half seasons. Winsor signed in August 2026 having impressed boss Glenn Howes during pre-season.

Ethan Taylor A prolific goalscorer, former Southampton academy striker Taylor scored 80 goals in just over 200 appearances for AFC Totton, playing a key role in the team's rise through the Southern League. During his time with the Stags, he helped the side secure two promotions in three seasons, which included scoring their decisive winning goal in the 2024/25 play-off final. Having joined Gosport Borough last summer, and after enjoying a productive campaign with another double-digit goal tally, scoring 13 league goals, the forward reunites with boss Glenn Howes once again having worked with him at both Totton and Gosport to become the Magpies new No 9.

Jayden Nielsen A wide player comfortable on either wing, Nielsen arrived at Dorchester Town this summer following two seasons with Taunton Town. A former Bristol City apprentice, the winger also spent a number of successful years with Bristol Manor Farm in the Southern League Division One South, making a big contribution as they reached two play-off finals in three seasons, and which also included being voted in the Southern League Division One South Team of the Season during his last campaign playing at this level in 2023/24.

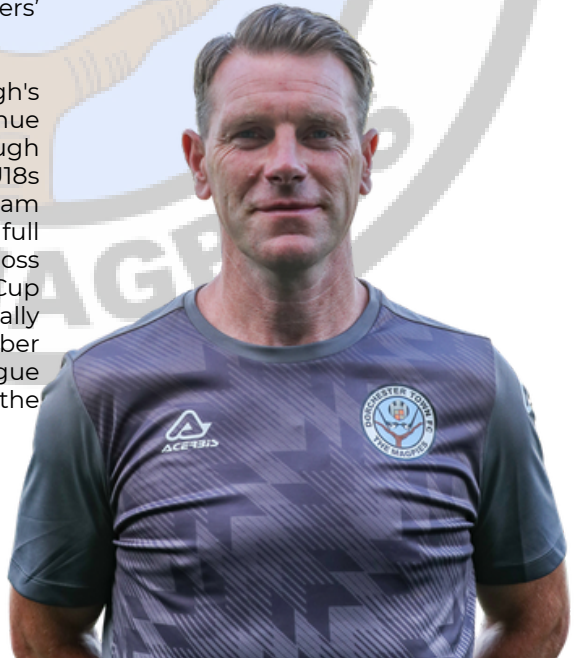

Matty Burrows Former AFC Totton, Wimborne Town and Portland United winger Burrows arrived at The Avenue in June 2026 following a season at Weymouth. The pacey forward, who off the pitch works as an academy coach at Champion Sports Group based at the stadium, has a history with winning the Southern League Division One South, having been a part of the AFC Totton squad that won the title in the 2022/23 season, as well as spending a spell on loan at Wimborne during their title-winning campaign the following year.

Freddie Beale A talented hometown winger, Beale was part of AFC Bournemouth's academy for several years before joining Eastleigh where he has progressed through their academy over the past three seasons. Having signed for Magpies boss Glenn Howes ahead of the upcoming 2026/27 season, the teenage forward has also gained valuable first team experience with Portland United and, more recently, Brockenhurst, where during an impressive campaign he scored 15 goals and scooped the Supporters' Player of the Season award.

Fin Murray Previously part of Eastleigh's academy, Murray arrived at The Avenue following a season with Gosport Borough where he impressed as part of their U18s side and progressed into the first team setup - which included making his full senior debut under now-Magpies boss Glenn Howes in the Hampshire Senior Cup in early 2026. The forward, who usually plays just behind the striker in the number 10 role, also made his Southern League Premier South debut for Gosport on the final day of last season.

Glenn Howes – Manager Former Magpies midfielder Howes has a long association with the club and needs little introduction to supporters – known for his all action and fully committed displays in the heart of the midfield during his playing days in black and white, he returned to the club over 15 years later in the dugout as manager, where he and his coaching staff turned the club around and oversaw a revival in our fortunes, before later linking up with Tom Killick as his assistant which led to us finishing in the play-off places the season before last. After making the hard decision to depart the club after four years last summer, and following a season as manager at league rivals Gosport Borough, Howes returned home to The Avenue for a second spell in charge in May 2026. Howes also has history with the Southern League Division One South title - having first been appointed as Magpies manager in 2021 from AFC Totton, who at the time sat top of the division, he also previously won that league title with Blackfield & Langley during an incredibly successful five-year spell.

So here we go! Have fun and enjoy the season.

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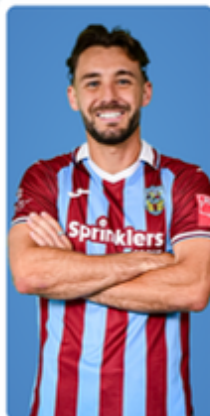
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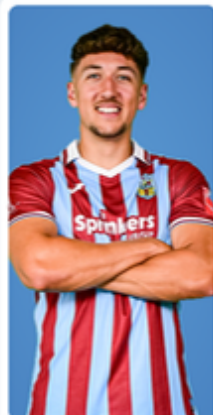
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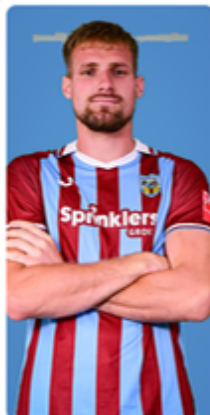
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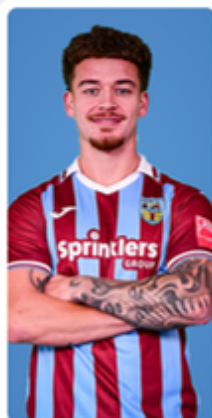
