Right now let's get back to giving the lads our best support for the game today. Terras' fans were terrific during the Dorchester game. We go again today!

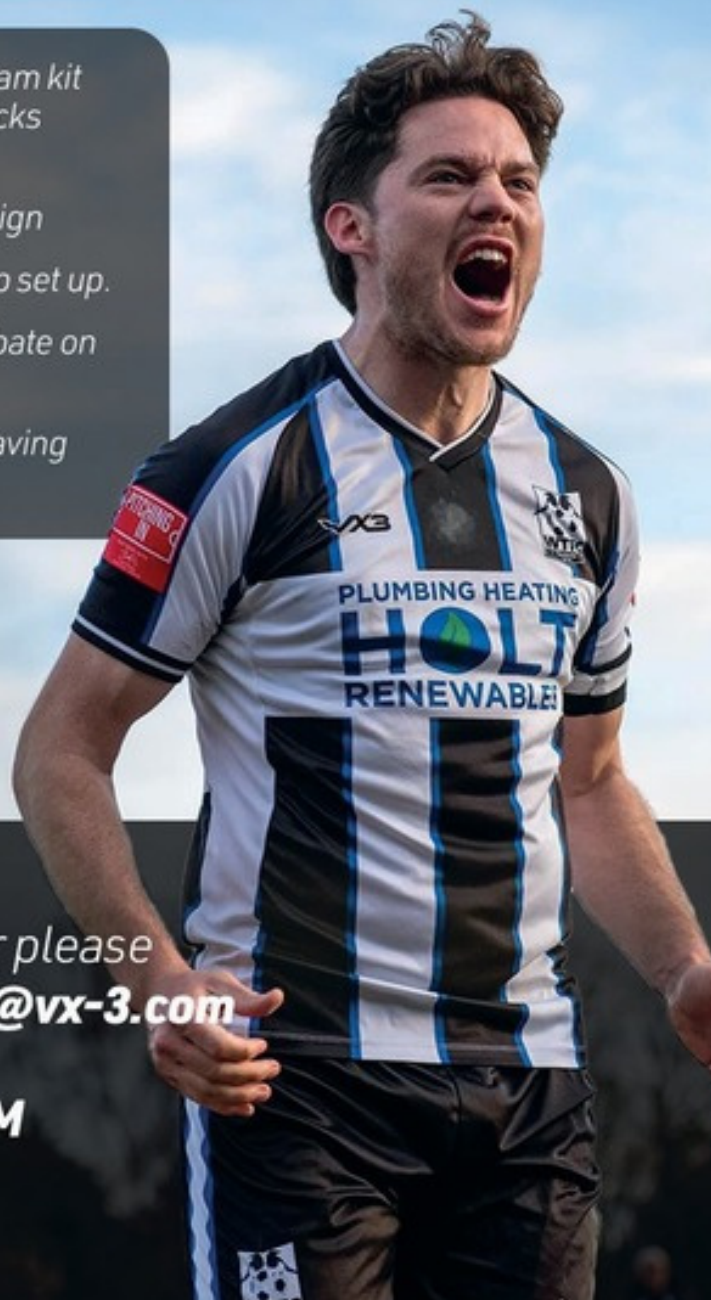
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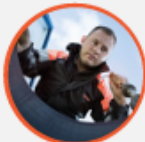
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We're pleased to announce the return of our "Boost the Budget" campaign for the upcoming season!

vs Falmouth Town

We may have only faced Falmouth three times in our history but all three games were certainly eventful! The first meeting in Cornwall in the 1975-76 season was in the FA Trophy and the match was almighty scare for the Terras. The home side made light work of the two division gap between the teams and they took a worthy lead into the break. However, ex-West Brom and England hero Jeff Astle quickly restored parity for the visiting Terras with a 53rd minute penalty before putting them ahead ten minutes later. The drama was far from over though as Falmouth equalised with a "scorcher" and just when it looked as though the minnows had earned a replay at the Rec, a mistake from the home goalkeeper allowed Derek Courtney to walk the ball into the net.

A great escape and Terras moved on to the round of 32 in the competition but as luck would have it the same two teams were drawn against each other in the same round of the competition the very next season! Once more Falmouth ensured they were a stern test for the travelling Terras and this time they did one better than before, earning a replay at the Recreation ground.

If these Terras performances appear a little "below par" against a side two

steps below in the non-league pyramid then it is important to add a little context. To say the 1970's were the heyday for the Cornish side is a little of an understatement. From 1971 until 1978 they amassed 8 league titles in a row and in a 20 year period from 1959 until 1978 they never finished outside the top 5. They also enjoyed a 58-match unbeaten streak in the Western league leading up to 1976. Despite this incredible sequence being in the lowly South Western and then the Western league, one suspects had they joined the Southern league during this era (where Weymouth plied their trade) they would have more than held their own, evidenced by the fact they reached the first round proper of the FA cup on three occasions in the 1960's. The crippling cost of traveling from their West Cornwall home probably the reason for their lack of pyramid progression at the time.

All of this confidence clearly led to the Falmouth manager to proclaim before the replay that Weymouth were the "poorest Southern league side I have seen!" At first the Terras made a mockery of the disparaging comments to enjoy a 2-0 half-time lead but the perennial champions came back to draw the game level before a dramatic winner a minute from time sealed the Weymouth win.

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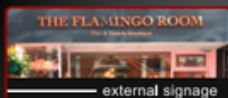
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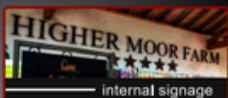
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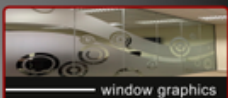

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FALMOUTH TOWN A BRIEF HISTORY

FALMOUTH TOWN joined the old Cornwall Senior League in 1950 before becoming founder members of the South Western League in 1951/52. After several homes, the sale of their Ashfield ground to Shell-Mex BP enabled the purchase of their present home at Bickland Park.

By the late 1950's, professionalism was introduced and this led to Falmouth winning their first trophy, the SWL Cup, in the 1957/58 season and retained it the following season. Season 1961/62 saw Falmouth Town win the treble of League Championship, League Cup and Cornwall Senior Cup. The following season history was made when they became the first ever Cornish club to reach the First Round Proper of the FA Cup where they lost 1-2 at home to Oxford United whose team included Ron Atkinson, in front of a crowd of 8000. Town reached the First Round on two more occasions in 1967 and 1969 losing both times to Peterborough United, first 5-2 away and then 1-4 at home.

After more domestic success and winning the South Western League for four consecutive years, Town joined the Western League in season 1974/75. They won both the League and League Cup in their first season without losing a single game and then won the League Championship in the following three seasons. Whilst in the Western League, Falmouth won the Cornwall Senior Cup in four successive seasons, from 1975/76 to 1978/79.

In 1975, midfielder Roy Carter left to join Hereford United in the Football League, going on to play for Swindon Town, Torquay United, Bristol Rovers and Newport County. The following year Town's ace goal scorer Tony Kellow was sold to Exeter City for a record transfer fee of £12,000 and remains their all-time top goal scorer. Club record goal scorer Joe Scott departed in 1978 for Bournemouth,

having netted 204 goals in just 267 games. After nine seasons, increased travelling expenses forced Falmouth to resign from the Western League and not being accepted back into the South Western League, had to enter the Cornwall Combination League which they won at the first attempt. Back in the South Western League they became champions again in 1985/86 which was won several more times along with numerous cups. A period of turmoil then followed with ups and downs in the clubs' fortunes both on and off the pitch.

With the formation of the South West Peninsula League, Falmouth Town plied their trade in the Premier Division but never achieved any success until the appointment of local lad and player, Andrew Westgarth. Being his first appointment as manager of any club, he had a steep learning curve. The pendulum eventually started to swing in the right direction and after a period of steady progress Westgarth led the club to its first success in many years when in season 2017/18 the club won the South West Peninsula League Cup and the League Charity Bowl. In 2018/19 the Cornwall Senior Cup was won and following two incomplete seasons due to the Covid Pandemic, in the first full season after the FA instigated a revised pyramid system (2021/22), Falmouth Town won the league championship for the first time and with-it promotion to the Western League. To complete a fantastic season, the Cornwall Senior Cup and League Charity Bowl were also won, completing a magnificent treble.

Back in the Western League, in their second season playing at Step 5, the FA Vase Quarter-Finals were reached and another Cornwall Senior Cup was won beating St Austell. Falmouth also gained promotion to the Southern League Division One South beating Barnstaple Town and then Clevedon Town in the play-

offs so would be playing at their highest ever level.

The 2024/25 SLDIS season saw a six-game winning run from the Boxing Day 2-1 home win over Mousehole to rise out of the relegation places and earn the January "Team of the Month" award. A five-game unbeaten streak in the last eight days of the season resulted in a well-deserved

ninth place league finish along with a fifteenth Cornwall Senior Cup win beating St Austell once again in the final.

Our second campaign at Step 4 was once again disrupted by the weather like the season before, but a fourteenth-place league finish was secured. At the end of the season, Andrew Westgarth stepped down as manager after eleven years in charge, replaced by John Fabby who had been acting as his assistant during the campaign.

Morgan Jones (Goalkeeper): 20 years old

Morgan played for Helston Athletic in the Jewson Western League Premier Division making 26 appearances last season and was their captain before signing for Town. Previously Truro City reserves playing under Jon Fabby, Morgan had an eventful debut at Bickland Park saving an injury time penalty to secure a 2-1 victory over high flying Shaftesbury.

Harrison Jewell (Defender): 23 years old

Harrison joined at the start of the 24/25 season after spending seven years with local rivals Helston, where he captained the side to the Western League title in 2023/24. LAST week, we received confirmation that new pitch perimeter barrier rules have been introduced by the Football Association for Non-League clubs following its review into ground safety across the National League System.

It means that solid brick, breeze block and concrete barriers around pitches will finally now be a thing of the past at grounds across the country at Steps 1-6.

The FA review was called following the tragic passing of striker Billy Vigar, who died after suffering a significant brain injury following a collision with a perimeter wall while playing for Chichester City against Wingate & Finchley on September 25, 2025. He was just 21 years old.

After Vigar's death, a petition calling for a ban on brick walls around football pitches across the NLS received more than 4,000 signatures.

It came after Bath City's Alex Fletcher suffered a fractured skull after colliding with a concrete advertising hoarding during a match in November 2022.

Six months later, then Sports Minister Stuart Andrew joined forces with the Professional Footballers' Association (PFA) in writing to the FA, Premier League, English Football League and National League, calling on them to adopt a more proactive approach to player safety in this area.

Now, almost four years on, it has taken the most tragic of deaths to spark any kind of action. And even then it took 11 months to deliberate and pass! I mean, what on earth was there to discuss?

I've been openly critical of the Football Association and the relevant authorities for letting this fester for so long,

Still, we got there in the end and at least now Billy Vigar's legacy can go to helping protect and preserve player safety in years to come.

Around 160 football clubs affected by the changes have been informed of the updated regulations and will be required to take appropriate action "within a reasonable timeframe".

They have been told that all existing barriers that don't meet the criteria must be removed, or at the very least covered or protected.

Financial support will be available to clubs with the FA and the Premier League providing funding through the Premier League Stadium Fund.

In a statement last week, the FA said: "We have undertaken a review of pitch perimeter walls across the National League System and Women's National League to identify what improvements can be made to our Stadium Accreditation Criteria that will help clubs mitigate potential safety risks at their grounds and stadiums.

"As a result of this ongoing phased review, which has been conducted by independent Health and Safety experts, we have updated our Stadium Accreditation Criteria for the 2026/27 season.

"This includes introducing revised criteria relating to pitch perimeter barriers, which no longer permits solid brick, breeze block or concrete barriers around pitches across the National League System for men [Steps 1-6], and the Women's National League [Tiers 3-4].

"Any existing solid brick, breeze block or concrete barriers must be removed as soon as reasonably practicable or covered with suitable protection if they cannot be removed for structural reasons.

"We have informed the clubs at this level that will be required to take action as a result of these changes."

Following last Friday's announcement, a PFA spokesperson said: "Following the tragic death of Billy Vigar last year, we again highlighted these concerns and made clear our view that the lack of progress and leadership on this issue had been unacceptable.

"As part of working groups set up by the FA following Billy's death, we pushed for the FA's Stadium Accreditation criteria to be amended to ban these types of walls so that there is a clear and centralised policy for clubs to follow.

"Given that, it's a welcome step that the FA's regulations have now been changed to reflect that position.

"However, it will now be important for progress on the removal of such walls - and effective mitigation of risks ahead of their removal - to be properly monitored, and for clubs to be given the support they need so that these changes can happen as soon as possible. Player safety must always come first."

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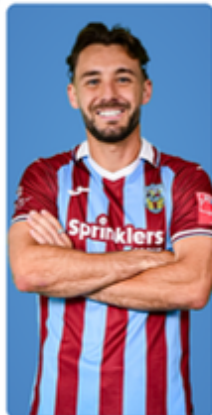
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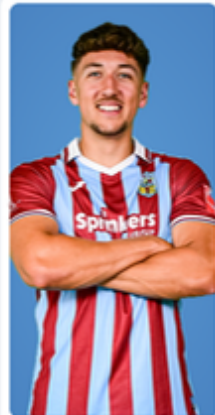
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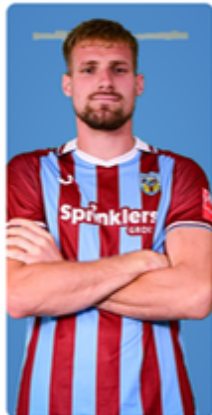
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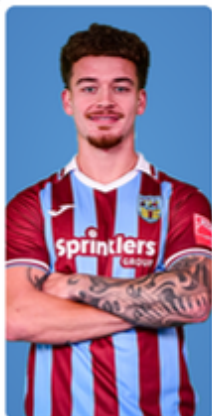


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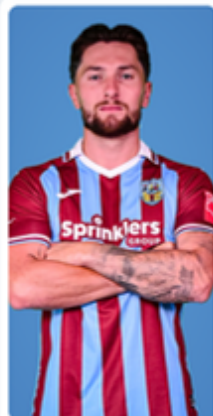


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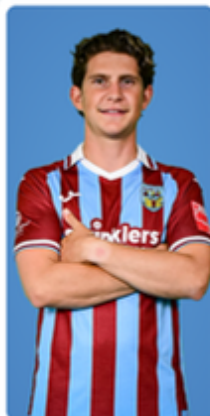
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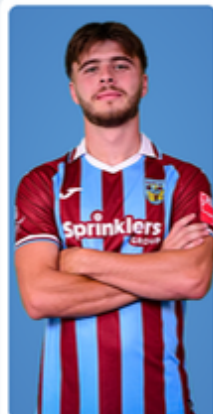
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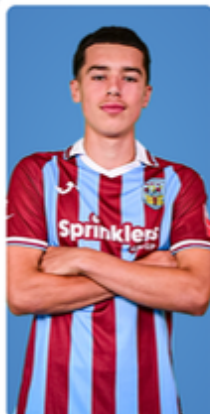


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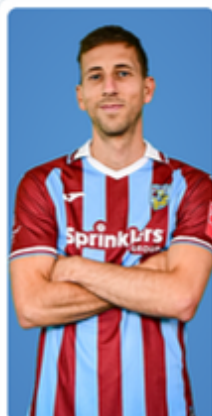


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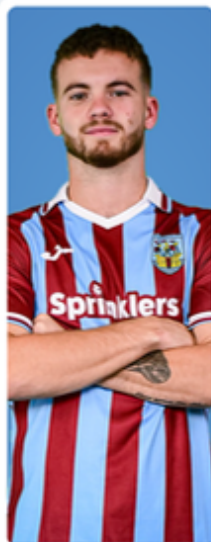


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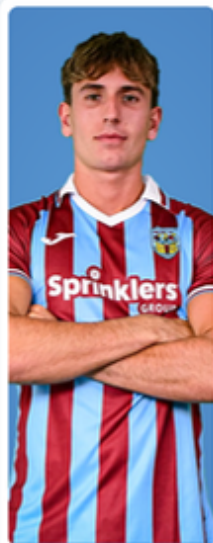


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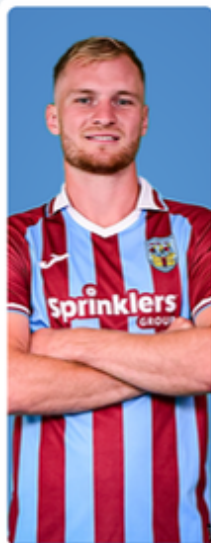


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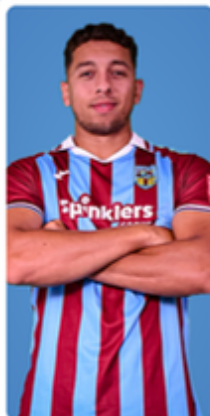
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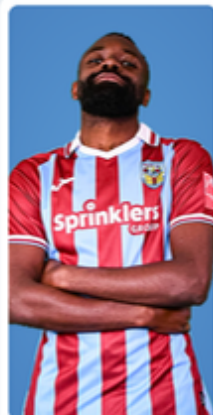


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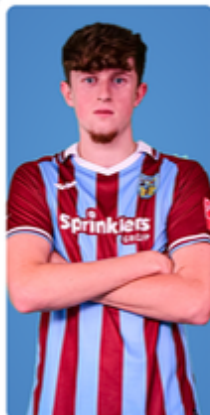
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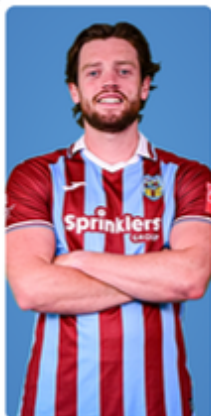


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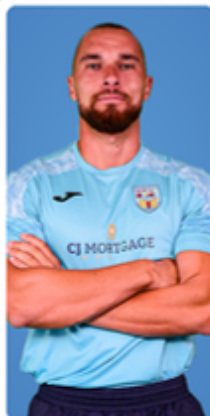
