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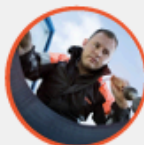

NUMBERS BEHIND THE GAME vs Melksham Town



I am sure even the most devoted Terras fan of a certain vintage will be hard pushed to remember the pair of games we played against this Wiltshire side but play them we did back in 1987!

Those two games were both in a much maligned competition called the Western Counties League Floodlit Cup. Along with its "league" version these two endeavours were designed to give youth players in the region a run out and create evening income for teams but with low crowds and first team players often on the pitch, the benefit was questionable!

But duty bound to play these games we were and the Terras progressed in this two-legged affair. A fresh-faced 21-year-old Steve Claridge scored one of the three goals at home in the first leg and although we lost the return leg 3-4 we progressed on aggregate.

Melksham's story is similar to one of many in rural Wiltshire – Western league stalwarts for decades before four successive top 5 finishes in that premier division enabled them to move up to the Southern league division one. They are currently enjoying their 9th campaign at this level. So yes, although this is an FA Trophy tie today they are very much also our league rivals too this season... and in fact we play them in that competition just two days after this tie!

Facing the same club twice in a row in two different major competitions is pretty rare, for Weymouth at least. The last occasions were in the 2014/15 season when it happened twice. We faced Bideford in the league (away win) and then in the FA cup (home win) before later in the season facing Burnham (Middx.) in the FA Trophy (away draw) and then in the league (away win).

In terms of familiar faces – many Terras fans will remember one current Melksham player Mark Cooper, the defender playing over 100 games for us in three seasons from 2016. However he may not feature this Saturday following a nasty clash of heads in a game a couple of weeks ago that led to the former Terra requiring over 20 stitches and an abandonment!

Back to this weekend and the FA Trophy where we find ourselves entering at the 1st qualifying round stage. We are obviously not used to making our trophy bow so early but we have entered at this stage a few times before – most recently in 2018/19. However, due to a restructuring of the rounds since then we are one of 320 teams still within a shot of Wembley compared to 212 that season! In terms of dates this is easily the earliest we have played an FA Trophy game, beating the previous record of 17th September 1994 by nearly 3 weeks!

Can the Terras milk this tie for all its worth against Melksham?!

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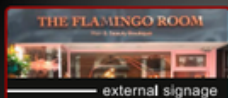
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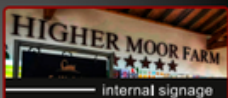
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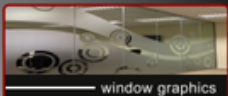

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MELKSHAM TOWN A BRIEF HISTORY

The club was established as Melksham Football Club in 1876. In 1894 we were founder members of the Wiltshire League. We were Division One champions in 1903–04 and won the Wiltshire Senior Cup the following season. In 1920 the club was renamed Melksham & Avon United as a result of their new ground being owned by Avon Rubber, before reverting to our original name in the 1926–27 season. They were runners-up in the league in 1924–25, 1929–30 and 1936–37. In 1951 the club adopted our current name and went on to finish as runners-up in Division One in 1959–60 and 1971–72, also winning the Wiltshire Senior Cup again in 1969–70.

We moved up to the Western League in 1974. After finishing third-from bottom of the league in 1975–76, we were demoted to the new Division One as the league expanded to two divisions. We won the Wiltshire Senior Cup again in 1977–78 and were Division One champions in 1979–80, earning promotion to the Premier Division. Their first season in the Premier Division saw us win the Wiltshire Premier Shield, a trophy they retained the following season and won again in 1984–85 and 1985–86. However, we were relegated to Division One again at the end of the 1987–88 season.

In 1992–93, we finished bottom of Division One and were relegated to the Premier Division of the Wiltshire Football League. We won the Premier Division and the Senior Knock-Out Cup the following season, and were promoted back to the Western League

at the first attempt. In 1996–97 we were Division One champions and were promoted to the Premier Division. Winning the Wiltshire Premier Shield the following season, and again in 1999–2000, before winning the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 2002–03 and 2007–08. Although we were relegated to Division One in 2009–10, we were Division One runners-up in 2010–11, earning promotion back to the Premier Division.

We won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 2012–13 and 2013–14, before winning the Western League Premier Division title in 2014–15. However, delays to making ground improvements meant that we were denied promotion. The following season saw us win the Senior Cup again. The club were runners-up in the Premier Division in 2017–18, earning promotion to Division One West of the Southern League.

Our Stadium

We played at Challymead Common until moving to the Old Bear Field in 1883. Relocating to the Conigre in 1920; the ground was part of the Melksham House estate, centrally sited in the town, which had been purchased in the same year by Avon Rubber, with the house turned into a social club.

A wooden stand was erected on one side of the pitch and wooden fencing installed around the ground. During the 1960s covered stands were built behind the Rugby Club End and on the other side of the pitch and floodlights were installed in 1986. The wooden stand was

demolished in the early 1990s and replaced by a modern metal stand in 1994.

In 2017, in preparation for redevelopment at the Melksham House site, the club moved to Oakfield Stadium, a new £7.3 million facility shared with Melksham Rugby Club on the eastern edge of the town. The first match at the new ground was played on 14 January 2017 against Bristol Manor Farm in the FA Vase, with the visitors winning 5–3 in front of a crowd of 1,215.

The club won promotion to the Southern League for the first time in our history under the guidance of Kieran Baggs shortly after the move to Oakfield. The team consolidated their position in their first season before Richard Fey and Nathan Rudge took over in the summer of 2019.

In November 2022 Richard Fey and his staff resigned from the club after three successful and stable years at the helm.

The club seeking an experienced replacement appointed ex Chippenham Town and Swindon Supermarine manager Mark Collier to the helm. With club stalwarts Luke Ballinger as assistant manager and David Thompson as a player coach.

During October 2025, Mark left the club after another three stable years at the club with the highlight being a decent FA Cup run in 2024, culminating in a trip to Surrey to face Carshalton Athletic.

David and Luke took over the reins in October 2025 for a brief run of games before Stuart Fleetwood took charge. After a brief upturn in fortune the club management changed again with the appointment of Kieran Baggs and Jamie Lyons. Both former players at the club, with Kieran having led the club into the Southern League almost a decade previously. Given an almost impossible mission to stay up, the side deservedly achieved Southern League status on the last day of the season against Falmouth Town in Cornwall.

Melksham Town continue to have an extensive youth section which provides a pathway for young people to play through the age groups before joining the Senior Men's and Women's sections. Our Reserve side currently play within the Wiltshire Senior League managed by Justin Flowers, whilst our Development side under Michael Coll are within the Trowbridge and District League and provide the link between our youth sides and senior football.

Recent years have seen numerous youngsters' step through the ranks to get their chance in the Reserve and First team.

GOALKEEPERS

Adam Forster - Adam is an experienced and well regarded goalkeeper who joined Melksham in the summer of 2025 from local side Larkhall Athletic where he played in 2024. Adam has played at Yate Town, Bath City and Dorchester Town, whilst also having a spell in the United States. A superb shot stopper who also directs the defence well.

Louis Knight – Louis is a young keeper who has previous experience with Aldershot Town, Fleet Town and Bemerton Heath Harlequins. A local Wiltshire lad who impressed during pre season in 2026.

DEFENDERS

Will Christopher - Will despite his young age is a vastly experienced player who began his career with Swindon Town. A powerful but cultured defender who can operate across the back line and also in midfield if needed. After leaving Swindon he has spent time at Cirencester, ourselves and Yate Town where he helped them to promotion in the 24-25 season. Now back at Melksham, where Will's family have a long and successful history.

Alex Hallett – A no nonsense defender who was brought to the club in 2024. Strong, physical and a real team player who routinely puts his body on the line in both boxes. A threat when attacking but also a rock when defending. Previous clubs include Chippenham Town, Swindon Supermarine and Frome, alongside a spell with Paulton Rovers.

David Thompson – Vastly experienced and a club stalwart. With over 400 first team appearances, 'Thommo' has played for the club for many years and shows no sign of stopping. A combative but cultured defender who epitomises what the club is about. He has previously played for Frome Town and Paulton Rovers in his earlier career.

Mark Cooper - Mark rejoined Melksham, his home town team in the summer of 2024. A vastly experienced and respected

defender who started his career at Bristol Rovers. Mark then went on to play at Eastleigh, Chippenham, Newport, Weymouth, Frome and most recently at Corsham Town. Mark played for Melksham in our inaugural season in the Southern League and now bolsters the back line. A natural leader who is our Captain for the 2026 season.

Wayne Nderemani – Wayne is a left sided player with pace, energy and positiveness. He can operate anywhere on the left hand side and has been used as a winger when needed. A member of the Paulton Rovers promotion side in 25-26 he joins after also playing for local sides Yate Town and Larkhall Athletic.

Leon Greenland – Leon joined us from local neighbours Westbury United during October 2025 following a successful period as a mainstay within the Westbury squad. A strong and solid left footed defender who has played locally with Corsham Town, Larkhall Athletic and Bradford Town.

Tom Bradley – Tom is a strong and versatile defender who can play in a variety of roles within the back line. Signed from Paulton Rovers in 2026, Tom has previously been a mainstay at league rivals Larkhall Athletic where he was vice captain. With extensive Southern League experience, Tom brings this knowledge and awareness to Wiltshire.

Jordan Williams – Jordan joined in March 2026 from league rivals Portishead Town. A former Bristol City player he is a quick and skilful left sided player who can deliver into the box with accuracy. A solid addition to the Melksham squad.

MIDFIELDERS

Ralph Graham - The energetic midfielder has proven to be a vital asset as the fixtures come thick and fast. Whether coming off the bench or in the starting side, Ralph always has the potential to change a game with his attacking intent. A former Swindon Town professional, he has also played in the National League with Hungerford Town. He is an all action

player who has become a regular starter at Melksham during the past seasons and our vice captain this year. A leader and benchmark for the squad.

Archie Milne - Archie is a combative and all action midfielder who can operate in a variety of roles. Joining Melksham in the summer of 2025 he quickly has established himself as a player who likes a tackle but can also effectively create opportunities for himself and others. A former Swindon Town academy player he most recently featured at Corsham where he was very highly regarded.

Jake Hicks - Jake joined in the summer of 2026 after leaving National League side Weston Super Mare. A high energy player adept at both breaking up opposition play and creating chances. Jake has also played at Mangotsfield and Larkhall, prior to joining Weston Super Mare. An exciting addition to the Melksham squad.

Max Williams - Max is a stylish and composed midfielder who finished last season with Paulton Rovers after playing with Larkhall Athletic, Frome Town and Yate. Calm on the ball and already during pre season has shown the ability to score and create goals for his new side.

Joel Smedley - Joel is a skilful attacking midfielder who lists Chippenham Town, Westbury United and Paulton Rovers as his previous clubs. Energetic and busy he can play in both an attacking role and a more withdrawn midfield position.

Nathan Davis - Nathan is a skilful midfielder player, who previously has represented England in Futsal, and played for a host of local clubs including Calne Town, Corsham Town and with Hungerford Town prior to joining Melksham in 2024. Another locally based player who has fitted into the culture and ambitions of the club.

Leon Hardman - Leon has progressed through the Melksham youth ranks whilst spending time at the Swindon Town academy. A tall and athletic youngster who impressed during pre-season in 2025

and earned a position in the first team squad. Excellent and calm with the ball at his feet.

Oscar Hall - Oscar as captain of the successful under 18 team has progressed through the Melksham youth ranks and quickly gained a reputation for being a tenacious midfielder who is comfortable making passes and breaking up play.

FORWARDS

Dan McBeam - Dan rejoined Melksham in the summer of 2026. Previously with the club under Richard Fey, Dan is a direct and rapid attacking player who has previously spent time with Barnsley, Mangotsfield and Paulton Rovers. Capable of beating his man with pace and skill, a player who starred for Paulton Rovers in their promotion back to the Southern League in 25-26.

Kitan Jaiyeoba - Kitan is a tall and powerful forward who has previously played for Paulton Rovers and Cribbs. A natural goal scorer who is happy with the ball at his feet and running at defenders. He possesses electric pace and a real eye for goal. A welcome addition during the summer of 2026.

Harvey Pritchard - Harvey joined Melksham from local rivals Larkhall Athletic in the summer of 2026. A strong running attacker, who plays with vision and was a regular at the Bath based side. He regularly scores goals and also unselfishly can create chances for his teammates. He possesses an incredible workrate and energy.

Callum Kirkman - Callum is a youth product who has played through the youth groups and starred in the under 18 side last year. A quick footed, athletic youngster who has signed Southern League forms this year with the First Team. Locally based and keen to broaden his experience in Senior football.

Kyle Witt - Kyle originally joined Melksham from Malmesbury in 2024 where he hit the ground running and

and scored a number of important goals. He was part of the side which had a memorable FA Cup run before eventually losing at Carshalton Athletic in the last minute. An all action player who also works hard and runs non stop. Another player who rejoined in March 2026.

James Ollis – James joined us from Shaftesbury during the summer of 2026. He has previously had a very successful spell with local rivals Frome Town where he formed an impressive partnership with Kane Simpson. A natural goalscorer who has pace, strength and dynamism. James, despite his youth has decent pedigree at both Step 3 and 4.

Elliot Haffenden - Elliot is a local Melksham lad who signed with our reserve team during 2023 and immediately showed an eye for goal scoring six goals in only four starts. He was registered with the First team in March 2024 and immediately transferred his goalscoring form to the Southern League. He has since had spells away with Fairford and Paulton Rovers, before rejoining in March 2026.

Dylan Tate – Dylan is a New Zealander who brings huge physical presence and goalscoring ability to Melksham. Signed during August 2026, he has Southern League experience with Manor Farm and Larkhall in recent times. Disruptive in the opposing box he is a player who gives a different dynamic to the attacking side of the team.

MANAGEMENT

Kieran Baggs Kieran rejoined the club as manager in March 2026 from Western League pacesetters Paulton Rovers. No stranger to Melksham or the club he previously managed the team in their inaugural season in the Southern League, and prior to that on an exciting run in the FA Vase. Although still young, he is an experienced manager with knowledge of the Western, Hellenic and Southern Leagues.

Jamie Lyons - Jamie is a well-respected coach who joined Melksham following the appointment of Kieran as his assistant manager. With previous spells at Corsham, Bradford and Melksham, he has a reputation for working well with experienced players and developing youngsters.

Jack Beaty - Jack joined the back room team as kit manager in 2024 and has become an important part of the team working to make sure match days and training run smoothly.

Jordan Cook – Jordan forms part of the coaching and analytical team, joining with Kieran and Jamie in March 2026. Jordan has previously been with Cribbs, Corsham and Paulton. He forms part of the successful coaching staff.

Mickey Baggs – Mickey is a former player who has played for a number of the local Wiltshire sides and now rejoins the club which he coached with Kieran in the late 2010's. An experienced and enthusiastic voice on the sideline.

Nick Evans – Nick is another local Melksham man, who has played for many of the Melksham sides over the last twenty years. Currently he is the goalkeeping coach but also can be seen playing for the Vets when not on first team duty.

WHEN The NLP's very own columnist Tony Incenzo visited Fulwood Amateurs for their North West Counties First Division North game against Thornton Cleveleys on Easter Monday, he completed a truly epic groundhopping quest.

Fifty-four years after attending his very first Non-League match, broadcaster Tony, 63, had become the first journalist to visit all 2,000 grounds in the English National League System, earning him huge acclaim.

But it Tony's own words in his NLP column last week, the life of a Non-League groundhopper is "akin to painting the legendary Forth Bridge". Once you achieve your targets it is time to start all over again.

Such is the ever-changing landscape of the great English pyramid, Tony was suddenly presented with another 22 new Non-League grounds to visit ahead of the start of 2026-27 season.

A groundhopper's work is never done, it seems.

One of Tony's first missions this season is the visit new, or modified grounds, of

clubs he has already visited among his 2,600 or so ventures. Three to be exact. Take NPL Premier side Workington for example.

Whilst a state-of-the-art £16 million stadium is being built for the West Cumbrian outfit to replace their famous old Borough Park, they are playing at nearby Fibrus Community Stadium (Derwent Park) for the next two seasons or so. It is the home of Workington Town Rugby League club and has held a record crowd of 17,741 in years gone by. Then there's, North West Counties League First Division North side Woolton. They have reverted to their Simpson Sports Ground headquarters after bringing it up to Step 6 standard. They spent 2025/26 – their first season as a NLS club – groundsharing at nearby South Liverpool.
